"I'm afraid of Juju and what will happen
to me if I break the oath."

"My family and I are being threatened."

"My boyfriend pushed me into prostitution."

"I'm frightened and feel helpless
and hopeless."

The Asylum Process in Germany



Arrival and registration at a receiving center (or anKER center)



Application for Asylum



Personal Interview with the Federal Office for Migration and Refugees (BAMF)



Decision is made on the asylum application on the basis of the interview



The decision is issued in writing along with advice on how to appeal if the application is rejected.

Challenges facing West African VoTs in the asylum-seeking process



- Decline in the use of the Sovereignty Clause
- Principle of Mutual Trust
- Cross-cultural barriers
- Conflicts of national interest

Type of Benefit	Adult Monthly Provision	Child Monthly Provsion
Social Assistance/Unemployment	360 € - 449 €	285 € - 376€
Housing allowance/subsidies	*based on various factors	
Additional Child Benefit		219 € - 250€
Additional Child Subsidies		177 € - 314€
Child Education/Extracurricular		28 €

Additional Benefits Paid:

- **Housing/Heating**
- **Lump Sum: Furniture for first apartment**
- **Additional money during pregnancy and childbirth**
- **Contributions to compulsory health and nursing insurance**
